ACTIVITY GUIDE

On her first day haunting a new school, all Mimi has to wear are old Chinese gowns from her great-great-great-great-ghost-grandmother. She wants to look horrifying and rattle chains with the cool American ghouls at school, but her ghost ancestors insist she dress and behave like a good Chinese ghost. Desperate to fit in and find a middle haunting ground between her cultures, she plans a ghastly new look. But she questions whether her haunt couture is a fabulous fright or a grave mistake when her family finds out, and another ghoul at school appropriates her Chinese fashion.

This ghoulishly playful ghost story offers a boo-tiful reminder that while sometimes school and family can make you feel invisible, bicultural pride never goes out of style.





PAPER CHAIN





- 1. Cut the pages from this activity sheet into strips and color the pieces, or use construction paper or any other paper you can find (with permission!).
- 2. Tape, glue, or staple the ends of one paper strip together into a ring. Try to match up the sides evenly. If you are using glue, hold the two ends of paper together until the glue dries.
- 3. Once you have one ring, thread another strip of paper through the center of that loop. Then, join the ends of the second strip together with tape, staples, or glue. The wide, flat edges of the two links should line up, but the loops themselves should sit at a 90 degree angle.
- 4. Continue in the same pattern until your chain is as long as you want it.
- 5. Once your chain is long enough, you can link the ends together with a final strip of paper. Wait until you have an odd number of links in the chain, then loop and seal one final strip of paper through both of the end-links.



ORIGAMI FRIENDS

ORIGAMI GHOST

To create this easy origami ghost, you will need a square sheet of paper that is white on both sides.



1) Fold your paper in half along one of the diagonals to make a triangle shape. Unfold.



2) Fold the left and right sides of the triangle into the middle line.



3) Fold the left and right corners back as shown.



4) Flip your paper over. Fold the flaps of the triangles you just made so they lay flat against the sides of your ghost.



5) Fold the left and right corners of the paper into the middle.



6) Fold the top triangle down slightly.



- 7) Make an accordion fold where the ghost's neck would be.
- 8) Flip your paper over. Fold the bottom point over as demonstrated in the photo.
- 9) Using a black marker, draw eyes and a mouth on your ghost.

ORIGAMI CAT

To create this easy origami cat, you will need a square sheet of paper in any color.



1) Fold the bottom corner up to meet the top corner to create a triangle.



2) Take the right points over the left and make a small crease along the bottom edge to mark the middle. Then unfold.



3) Take the right point and bring it up and to the right at an angle away from the top point.4) Do the same on the left side, trying to match the right.




5) Fold the bottom point up a little to form the cat's chin.



6) Flip the paper to the other side. Fold the top points down to about where the left and right points line up.



7) Flip the paper again. Fold the top points back.





9) Draw eyes, a nose, and a mouth for your cute face!

MAKE NEW FRIENDS

Use the following activities in a group to get to know each other better!

QUESTION BALL

Write a bunch of icebreaker questions on a medium-sized ball. Toss the ball and whichever question your right thumb lands on, you have to answer that question. You also have to say your name before you answer.

HUMAN OUTLINE

Two people are randomly paired together. They get one long piece of paper (about 6 ft sheet), lie on their backs, and take turns tracing one side of each other. Person #1 traces Person #2's left side, and Person #2 traces Person #1's right side. When both are done, they list fun facts about each other on their side. They then show it to the rest of the group.

M&M OUESTIONNAIRE

Distribute fun size bags of M&Ms to everyone in the group. Go around the circle and instruct each person to pull out one M&M from their bag. Each color of M&M represents a question. (Red could be "Name one hobby" and blue could be "Name one of your favorite bands".) When the person answers, they can eat their M&M. Continue until all the M&Ms are gone.

THREE WORDS

Tell everyone to think of three words to describe themselves. Go around the room and have people introduce themselves and say the three words they chose.
